

# Minutes of the Annual General Meeting, Thursday 8 February 2018 at the Nova Scotia.

# 1. Apologies:

## 2. Bosun's Report:

The power boat is in for a service on Wednesday ready for Saturday.

An old Topper with split hull has been donated to a school for use in their playground.

Can everyone please write any breakages or defects with club boats or property on the board in the club room.

New flooring is being laid in the club room on Wednesday and can everyone please wipe their feet before entering.

Bosun's day will be on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> Feb. Can as many as posible attend please.

The compound is nearly full but we do have a couple of spaces coming up.

Chris Q. said that the mark buoys are splitting. If anyone can get replacements it would be useful please.

The club enterprise needs some work to the bailers which leak.

#### 3. Treasurers Report:

Income has fallen by £1000 on last year but spending has also reduced by more so the balance is healthy.

Membership and storage fees can remain unchanged for another year.

Insurance £900, Harbour Master Licenses £3000, BCC Compound £2200

The boat fund stands at about £3600

#### 4. Commodore's Report:

Ben said this he was now entering his third year as Commodore so would have to step down next year as will Kathy as Treasurer. We will need replacements next year so if anyone is interested please let us know.

He was pleased to see the club still doing well with membership levels healthy.

The clubs size is limited by the size of the water and boat storage.

Last year we entered the Avon Triangle thanks to Rich S and Isla for getting us involved. We were 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> overall.

This year it will be held here at BWSC on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2018. We can enter up to 3 teams of 3 and will need anyone interested to volunteer. Last year we had

This year we had a problem with AllAboard using the race course for learners. This was resolved swiftly and all seems to be well now. We must ensure OODs wear HiViz top so AllAboard know who is in charge on our side. There will also be a duty manager from AllAboard.

The Hansa TT (Sailability Access Boats) is back with us this year. This will be run as a joint venture between BWSC (running the race side) and AllAboard providing back up etc. We will need lots of help for this please. This will be June 2<sup>nd</sup>.

June 3<sup>rd</sup> will see the Comet Open again for which we will also need help.

The new website is up and running thanks to Adrian Mac. John G and Tom Diffey. Please visit it regularly as there will be lots of news and notifications on it.

There have been a few training sessions on rules and OOD duties.

The club room is looking good and now also has new flooring. Please bring your slippers.

# 5 Vice Commodore's Report:

# 8 Corporate Membership for AllAboard

Ben explained that we are trying to get the Race Squad able to race with us as well as some Instructors. He proposed that we might achieve this by coming to an arrangement with AllAboard for an Associate Membership.

We need young members for to ensure the future of the club

We want to help Instructors learn about racing and also encourage newly qualified Sailors from the school to think about joining the club. Most will think they are not good enough although they are.

RYA is concerned that many many people learn to sail but never sail again.

A long and lively discussion took place.

Some feel we must have a substantial safeguarding policy in place.

Some worried youngsters will be dumped with no way to contact parents if anything goes wrong.

Some worried about huge numbers of AllAboard people sailing.

It was agreed that the committee would finalise details and report back and an EGM could be held to finally agree.

#### 9 Shorter Pursuit Races

Richard J has suggested that pursuit races are very long being based on a 60 minute race for a boat with a 1000PY. The Gull races for 82 minutes and even the K1s are 64 minutes. As pursuit races cannot be shortened they are frequently not held if the weather is unpleasant or there is insufficient time due to the pursuit race being the last of the season with shorter daylight hours.

Richards proposal was to have a shorter time or to have two pursuit times for a long race or short race at the discretion of the OOD.

It was pointed out that the races could be shortened if OODs wanted to by using average lap times to decide result.

The proposal was rejected.

# 10 Scoring System Changes

Adrian MacF proposed that the scoring system should be changed. At present anyone not entering a race is scored the number of boats in the whole series plus 1. This means the series overall standings cannot be calculated until the end of the series resulting in lots of aborted work. However this is in line with Appendix 9 of the RRS.

He suggested that boats who did not attend be scored the number of starts plus 5.

The proposal was agreed

# 11 Any Other Business

Ben said it was proposed that there should be a separate prize for crew of the year.

The proposal was agreed.

Graham asked if he might donate a trophy for this. Agreed.

# 10 Prize giving

Prizes were presented to series winners as listed under Vice Commodores report above.

Post meeting note: It was discovered there is a discrepancy between the Vice Commodores series winners and those shown on the club website. This will be reviewed.

### Appendix A Vice-Commodore's Report:

The club programmed 52 races. Included in the results are 42 races. I have no results for the Tuesday evening and Sunday races. Normally the 5 series races would total 35 races but only 27 were held, one being abandoned due to weather. There has been an increase in other events on Saturday totaling 8 events.

Included in the 42 races is the club regatta 3 races, 3 racves on the Comet Open Meeting and 3 races in the CVRDA event. Their first event was canceled by the CVRDA

There were 38 boat entries, using 30 different classes of dinghy.

A total of 41 members sailed or were race officers & 35 visitors sailed.

14 members appeared in 10 or more races

10 members appeared in 5 to 9 races

17 members appeared in 1 to 4 races

Total 418 races

Visitors appeared in 76 races

Total 498 races.

There were an average of 9.24 boats raced.

10.6 people involved in each race

Visitors included 6 CVRDA members racing 15 boat entries

9 Comet members racing 27 boat entries.

Harbour Recreational Users Group

March

South West boat show to be at the Harbour Festival

Plans for power boat racing in the Harbour

Nobody who attends HRUG reports back from the Harbourside Forum

A number of thefts and break-ins have been reported

June

Group requested involvement in establishing more water based activities at the Harbour Festival which is currently portrayed as a waterside drinking weekend. An approach is to be made to REM. (Richmond Events Management)

Car parking at Cottage and HM offices promised a barrier for the Cottage and permits for the HM car park. May have to wait until Metrobus is up and running.

Request that keys are signed for when obtained from the Harbour office

Continuing request for guarding to the Baltic Wharf pontoon

Request for an understanding of the Underfall Yard Trust relationship with BCC and HM

Dry dock to be brought back into commercial use

September

Need to arrange a group to be involved in 2018 Harbour Festival with MR

GC had met with Julie Sienesi, director of the Underfall Yard Trust for their involvement in the Festival

Parking :- plans for a contractor to take over the management of parking issues

Request for the toilets in the HM car park to be re-opened; request denied.

December

Harbour Festival developing :- Boat Club Challenge, best dressed boat, SW Boat Show. MR is now the "Maritime Curator" for the festival and is committed to more activities on the water.

Use of the entire water rather than at the amphitheatre, the map of the harbour in the programme stopped at the SS Great Britain.

Gloucester Festival puts Bristol to shame.

GC request for an update on who is managing all of the dilapidated boats in the boat park and when will action be taken.

January

Meeting at REM offices to discuss proposals for the Harbour Festival

Many proposals, some achievable, some expensivebut general enthusiasm to improve the festival.

BWSC have offered to provide a sail-by from The Cottage to Prince Street Bridge with commentary on the type of boats with possibly an invitation to the CVRDA. We are also entered for the team event

Sunday will compise a televised skulling sprint with international interest.

BWSC Calendar of events for 2018 has been approved by the HM (on the fourth draft) and all details have been published in the Notice to Mariners.

Relationships regarding premises and activities:

BWSC is a tenant, renting the boat storage compound from BCC

BCC owns the premises occupied by the Underfall Yard Trust

We will be invited to put sails on the water for events hosted by the Underfall Yard Trust

We will seek publicity and make ourselves indispensible, supported by the contacts made who are influential in the Harbour and Harbourside.

Powerboats proposal by BRM Europe, HM and RYA permission required.

Interest in rowing sprints from Prince St to SSGB.

Doors open days expanded from 7th to 10th September

June

No powerboats in 2017 as need for full site management plans by safety advisory group, police and fire, licencing and public consultation.
